




Highlights

George Zongolopoulos:

The Vision of Public Sculpture



In collaboration with the George Zongolopoulos Foundation, the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center is organizing the first exhibition exclusively dedicated to the Greek iconic artist's public sculptures, installed in Greece and other countries.

The exhibition traces how Zongolopoulos' public sculpture charges and converses with installation sites, locations in which it enters into a discourse with the public on a daily basis; it moreover highlights the importance of public art – all the more relevant since this exhibition is held at SNFCC, which aspires to redefine the citizens' relationship with public space.

As part of this exhibition, eight sculptures will go on display in outdoor areas in the Agora and the Rear Agora.

Twelve more sculptures - four of them for the first time - will go on display at the 4th-floor atrium of



The size of Zongolopoulos' studio, the maquette of the Monument of Zalongo* commemorating the Dance of Zalongo, a mass suicide of women and children during the Souliote War of 1803, and the surrounding area, and part of a life-size umbrella from the Umbrellas sculpture will also go on public display for the first time.

Furthermore, the exhibition features videos on Zongolopoulos' life and work; educational programs (in Greek) based on the sculptor's work will take place in other SNFCC areas.

A guest of the SNFCC Cosmos Concert series, the ERT National Symphony Orchestra, returns to the Stavros Niarchos Hall.



ERT National Symphony Orchestra: D. Shostakovich, P. I.Tchaikovsky, D. Lavrangas

In SNFCC's Cosmos concert series, the ERT National Symphony Orchestra, which has been performing works by important Greek and international composers, with acclaimed conductors and researchers, since 1938, presents music by Dmitri Shostakovich, Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky, and Dionysios Lavrangas under the baton of Ender Sakpınar, principal conductor of the Istanbul State Symphony Orchestra (since 2015) and artistic advisor of the Eskisehir Metropolitan Municipality Symphony Orchestra. Featuring the acclaimed Greek pianist Titos Gouvelis.

The Greek Suite No. 1 for Orchestra by Dionysios Lavrangas – better known over half a century as the "aristocratic maestro" from Cephalonia – is a historic piece: It is the first Greek composition for orchestra. It evokes the atmosphere of mainland Greece, while preserving the clarity, orderliness, and measure of French music.

Dimitri Shostakovich composed his 2nd Concerto for piano in F major, op. 102, in 1957 for his son Maxim's 19th birthday. The latter premiered it during his graduation from the Moscow Conservatory. Lasting around 20 minutes, the concerto is in three movements, of which the second movement proceeds without pauseto the third.

One of the most popular nineteenth-century Russian composers, Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky wrote his 4th Symphony in F minor, op. 36 in 1877-1878; it premiered in 1878 in Moscow, under the baton of Nikolai Rubinstein. The composer dedicated this work to his friend and patron, Nadezhda von Meck. The symphony's opening fanfare is a most characteristic motif.

When your heart's desire is forbidden by culture and convention, what wins – love or duty?

The Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment (OAE), the orchestra that for three decades now has shocked, changed and mesmerized the music world, comes to SNFCC to perform songs of the heart with mezzo soprano Magdalena Kožená, under the guidance of conductor Giovanni Antonini.

OAE was formed as a self-governing ensemble in 1986. It is the UK's top period instrument ensemble, a resident orchestra of the Southbank Centre in London and associate orchestra at Glyndebourne Festival Opera.

OAE will present with Kožená for the first time in Greece a series of sublime opera arias by Mozart and Gluck. Sweet songs from The Marriage of Figaro meet bittersweet tales from Mozart's epic swansong, La clemenza di Tito, including Haydn's Scena di Berenice and arias from Gluck's Paride ed Elena and Il Parnaso Confuso. It's all tied together by Mozart's dramatic, emotive Symphony no. 40.

Kožená has worked with many of the world's leading conductors as well as distinguished recital partners performing at such prestigious venues as Carnegie Hall, Wigmore Hall, Alice Tully Hall, the Concertgebouw, Amsterdam, as well as at the Aldeburgh, Edinburgh and Salzburg festivals.

She is also in demand as a soloist with the Berlin, Vienna and Czech Philharmonics and the Cleveland, Philadelphia and Royal Concertgebouw Orchestras. Her operatic roles include Zerlina in Don Giovanni at the Salzburger Festspiele in 2002, returning in 2013 as Idamante, a role she has also sung for the Glyndebourne Festival and in Berlin and Lucerne. Magdalena made her first appearance at New York's Metropolitan Opera in 2003 as Cherubino in Mozart's Le nozze di Figaro and has since been a regular guest, including the title role in Jonathan Miller's production of Debussy's Pelléas et Mélisande in 2010/11. Other opera credits also include Oktavian in Richard Strauss's Der Rosenkavalier (Staatsoper Berlin 2009 and Osterfestspiele Baden Baden 2015), the title role in Bizet's Carmen (Osterfestspiele and Sommerfestspiele Salzburg 2012), Charpentier's Médée (Theater Basel 2015) and Martinů's Juliette (Staatsoper Berlin 2016).

Two extraordinarily creative musical artists, Nikolas Anadolis and Alex Drakos Ktistakis join forces in painting musical images using a palette of classical, jazz and world music colors.

Improvising, the two artists capture the inspiration and feeling of the moment. In a unique music performance, they invite the audience to feel the music and contribute to the atmosphere.

In the process, they practice instant composing and free improvisation. Each of these music collaborations is unique, unrepeatable.

Nikolas Anadolis has been improvising on the piano from a young age; he started classical piano lessons aged five and a half, and jazz won him over eventually. He has participated in masterclasses by acclaimed artists and has earned many accolades, including First Prize (2010) at the Martial Solal International Jazz Piano Competition, which takes place every four years in Paris, and the Clare Fischer Composition Award at Berklee College of Music (2012).

He has worked with many great musical artists and performed in several festivals in Greece and other countries, including at the legendary Blue Note Jazz Club in New York.

He is joined onstage by Alex Drakos Ktistakis, with a long academic experience teaching jazz at the Department of Music Studies, Ionian University, Corfu, and studies in music interpretation, jazz performance, and drums, who has worked with great names of the Greek and international music scene. He has made the arrangements for major Greek artists' shows and special tributes; he recently released *Tora*, featuring his latest compositions with the Alex Drakos Trio.

Nikolas Anadolis, piano Alex Drakos Ktistakis, drums Musical artists Thodoris Rellos and Jannis Anastasakis present their first joint release, *HORSELOVERFAT*, at the SNFCC Lighthouse.

The album is the fruit of their live improvisations and experimentations in the last five years, featuring excerpts from short stories by the American sci-fiction writer Philip K. Dick.

In their SNFCC concert, they are joined by vocalist Savina Yannatou and Nikos Sidirokastritis, a preeminent Greek jazz drummer, with an unmistakable style and sound.

For 30 years now, Thodoris Rellos has been involved in some of the most creative moments of contemporary live jazz and experimental music as well as record releases.

Jannis Anastasakis treats the guitar as a generator of original ambient sounds, while also using live sampling and effects; he also designs and manufactures Jam pedals. His music combines ambient and psychedelic sounds, striking a delicate balance between harmony and noise. He has worked with top names in Greek and international music, as well as with his personal project, "Elektronik Meditation".

In 1991, Andrew Weatherall put on his producer's hat and has helped Primal Scream to deliver one of the most definitive albums in the history of British pop, *Screamadelica*. Blurring the boundaries between rock and dance music, this album made the music press coin a new term to describe it: "rave 'n' roll." This is the briefest possible bio for Weatherall, a musical artist who has been reinventing himself in a variety of guises, for more than three decades now.


He is one of the most eclectic DJs of all times, equally able to make people dance in a rockabilly or a dub set. He is a sought-after remixer, whose unique approach has been used by artists including Happy Mondays (his studio debut was his remix of "Hallelujah"), Bjork, Siouxsie Sioux, The Orb, The Future Sound of London, New Order, Manic Street Preachers, My Bloody Valentine, Saint Etienne, and James. As a producer, he has launched to fame artists such as Beth Orton and Fuck Buttons; he has been member of memorable groups including 2 Lone Swordsmen, Sabres of Paradise and, more recently, the Asphodells.

Amidst all this creative activity, his first solo release came out only in 2006. Since then, he has constantly been adding to his personal discography; his latest releases included Qualia in 2017 and two EPs in 2018.

A devotee of pop culture, Andrew Weatherall claims that the history of pop music is endlessly fascinating because of its intrinsic democracy. Weatherall has cited humor as an important component in his musical ideology. He is also a great conversationalist in a number of topics, ranging from literature and poetry to fashion and the arts, and how these shape youth culture.

To top it all: He was there – playing a key role – in almost all musical styles since the mid-1980s.


Italian Opera Cycle



Guided Tours



Want to know more about the SNFCC? We offer daily **guided tours of its award-winning building complex**, home to the new premises of the Greek National Opera (GNO) and the National Library of Greece (NLG), designed by the Renzo Piano Building Workshop. Discover public areas and go backstage in the two buildings. We will visit the rehearsal spaces, the Stavros Niarchos Hall and the Greek National Opera's Alternative Stage, and stroll through the Library's Public Section, Reading Rooms and Vaults.

Guided tours of the Stavros Niarchos Park, which recently won the first prize at the European Garden Awards and is the largest public Mediterranean garden in the world, are conducted daily.

An example of state-of-the-art landscape architecture, the city's new Park is designed according to sustainability principles, with respect for the ecosystem and the challenges of an ever- changing environment. A welcoming, open space, whose vegetation and overall design capture the essence of the Mediterranean landscape, is open for visits daily.

Spyros Louis Cup

Conceived and designed by Michel Bréal for the champion of the first Marathon race – the Greek runner Spyros Louis – the Silver Cup was awarded at the first modern Olympic Games in Athens in 1896; today, it is on permanent display at the SNFCC.

This historic item was acquired by the Stavros Niarchos Foundation when it became available for sale by the runner's grandson at Christie's. As soon as the Cup was acquired, the SNF committed to making it accessible to the public, keeping it permanently on display at the SNFCC. Until then, over 3.5 million visitors had already admired the Cup when it was displayed at the Acropolis Museum in Athens and at the Olympic Museum in Lausanne.

Environmental Management

SNFCC earned the Platinum LEED certification as a green building - the highest distinction for environmental and sustainable buildinas. LEED certification is regarded as the highest possible distinction for environmentally friendly, sustainable buildings. It certifies that a building has been designed and constructed following rigorous principles of sustainable construction and environmentally innovative practices that focus on water and energy efficiency, reduction of CO, emissions, indoor environment quality, the rational management of resources. SNFCC is the first cultural project of this scale to earn the LEED Platinum Certification in Europe.

Smoking

Based on the requirements of the LEED certification program earned by SNFCC, smoking is prohibited in all SNFCC indoor areas and within 8 meters of any building opening. In all other SNFCC outdoor areas, smoking is not prohibited; visitors are asked to use the floor ashtrays available in the area. We encourage visitors to refrain from smoking while enjoying the Park.

Bicycles

SNFCC offers a bike rental system for children and adults. Please visit SNFCC.org/bikes for additional information, or inquire at the Visitors Center.

Free Shuttle Bus

For convenient access to and from SNFCC, daily transportation by shuttle bus is available to visitors free of charge. A shuttle bus bearing the SNFCC logo departs from Syntagma Square (intersection with Ermou Street), with a stopover at the Syggrou-Fix Metro station (Syggrou Avenue), and arrives at the SNFCC.

Every Sunday, between 10.30-12.30, the shuttle bus rides only between SNFCC and the Syggrou-Fix Metro Station since Syntagma is not accessible because of the Change of Guard ceremony.

In case of special traffic regulations the timetable may change.

The shuttle bus is accessible to people in wheelchairs, following prior scheduling via phone.

Mask: The Tools of Metamorphosis

A workshop by costume and set designer Angelos Mentis. The mask, as a reflection of the face in the mirror of imagination, holds a privileged position in the history of human expression.
